Dear Branch Secretary,

As you know, arising from a resolution of the 2007 Annual Delegate Conference, the Union's Solidarity Fund is financed from two main sources:

- Contributions from Branches of a stated amount (€0.50 per member as at the end of the previous year, rounded to the nearest full €, subject to a maximum of €1,000)
- a contribution from the Union's Central Funds each year equal to twice the amount due to be contributed by Branches in that year.

The Fund is used by the Union to support trade union causes in the underdeveloped world.

The Executive Committee would like to thank Branches for the Contributions made last year.

**The Executive Committee is now requesting Branches to make contributions to the Fund for the year 2017 as specified for each Branch in the Appendix to this circular.**

The Executive Committee is also making arrangements to make the amount of €8,950 available to the Solidarity Fund from Central Union Funds.

### **Action by Branches**

Each Branch is requested to make a contribution to the Solidarity Fund of an amount not less than the amount shown in the Column titled "Outstanding" in the Appendix to this circular.

Obviously, a Branch can contribute more if it wishes. Many thanks to those branches who have already contributed.
